



Thousand Yards Winged Shawl a CROCHET pattern in US terms

As pictured:

- Valley Yarns Valley Cotton 5/2 in Purple and
- Silk City Fibers Slinky Variegated in Coolwater Print



Has also been worked up in (not pictured):

- Brown Sheep Cotton Fleece
- Nashua Creative Focus Cotton DK

1000 yds of yarn in weights from lace to DK should give you a generous shawl. Choose your favorite yarn and hook, then work to your desired size!



STANDARDS
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Skill Level: Intermediate

Materials:

- DK- to light-worsted weight yarn (apx 1,000 yds)
- Size G7/4.50 mm or crochet hook of your choice for desired drape

Stitches and Abbreviations

tch: turning chain

Elmore (E) / extended double crochet (ext dc):

- yo, insert hook into stitch;
- yo and pull up a loop; ch 1
- [yo and pull through two loops] twice

Shell: 2 Ext dc / ch 2 / 2 Ext dc

NOTE: The first ext dc is worked into the same stitch from where the turning chain originates.

Reverse single crochet (rsc): With right side of work facing you:

- insert hook from front to back into stitch on your right
- pull up a loop
- yo and pull through both loops



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right-side:

Row 1

- ch 5, E in first ch;
- [ch 2, 2 E in same ch] three times. Ch 4, turn.

Ch 4, turn.

wrong side:

Row 2

- E in first st; sk next st;
- [Shell in next 2 st] twice;
- Shell in next ch-2 sp, sk next st;
- 2 ext in top of turning ch. Ch 4, turn.

Ch 4, turn.

Row 3

- E in first and next 2 st, sk next st,
- Shell in next ch-2 sp; sk next st;
- [E in next 2 st, sk next st, Shell in next ch-2 sp, sk next st] twice;
- E in next 2 st, 2 E in top of tch.

Ch 4, turn.

Row 4

- E in first and next 4 st, sk next st;
- Shell in next ch-2 sp; sk next st;
- [E in 4 st, sk next st, Shell in next ch-2 sp, sk next st] twice;
- E in next 4 st, 2 E in top of tch ch.

Ch 4, turn.

Row 5

- E in first and next 6 st, sk next st;
- Shell in next ch-2 sp; sk next st;
- [E in next 6 st; sk next st, Shell in next ch-2 sp, sk next st] twice;
- E in next 6 st, 2 E in top of tch.

Ch 4, turn.



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Row 6

- E in first and next 8 st, sk next st;
 - Shell in next ch-2 sp; sk next st;
 - [E in next 8 st; sk next st, Shell in next ch-2 sp, sk next st] twice;
 - E in next 8 st, 2 E in top of tch ch.
- Ch 4, turn.

For subsequent rows, continue in pattern to desired size, ending with a right-side / odd-numbered row, then ch 1.

Border:
Round 1

- Rotate (do not turn or flip) to work along edge:
- *2 sc around (not into) each E and sc in top of E on end of row across**;
 - sc in center from beginning row; rep from * to **;
 - 3 sc in top of first st, sc in ea st across (with 3 sc in ea ch-2 sp and 3 sc in top of last st).
- Sl st into first sc to end round.

Border:
Round 2

- Ch 1, reverse sc (rsc) in ea sc around.
Fasten off; weave in ends.
